I would like to acknowledge the work of Miss Buso over her more than 20 years at Oberon High School and close to 35 years of employment with the Department of Education. Mrs Anne Fuller remains on leave for Term 3 and is being replaced by Miss Kelsey Ratcliffe. Mrs Laura Brockway will not be completing the last six months of her 12-month contract at the school and Mrs Alex Molinari has begun Family Leave. The Mathematics classes of Mrs Brockway and Mrs Molinari will be taught by Mrs Sarah Tanis for the remainder of the year. Mr Josh Baker remains as acting Principal at Belmont High School for Term 3 and Mrs Priscilla Begg remains as acting Assistant Principal. The school is in the process of acquiring a wellbeing dog that will become part of our school community.


Many schools across Victoria now have wellbeing dogs in schools to support the mental health and wellbeing of students and staff members.

ICAS COMPETITIONS 2023

We are delighted to inform you that Oberon will be participating in the world-renowned ICAS competition this year. Students from Years 7-10 can select to enter an online competition where they answer questions in test conditions. There are multiple subjects to choose from. Each test has an individual cost and allows the student to see their results against other schools and to reward and acknowledge high academic achievement. Tests will be held at school between 7th Aug and 1st of September.

The competition questions are set in modern, realworld scenarios where school students are tested on their ability to apply classroom learning to new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problemsolving skills. There are 6 available competitions and subjects offered include literacy (English, Writing and Spelling Bee- year 7 only) and STEM (Mathematics, Science and Digital Technologies).

ICAS recognises every participant with a certificate, and top achievers with a personalised medallion. Over the years the ICAS medal and certificates have held pride of place in the portfolios of millions of students. "ICAS prepares our students for the future because it gives them an opportunity to challenge themselves beyond what they just cover in class and to tackle questions that have a competitive level of rigour and an international standard." To then get on the podium at WMR is again a great achievement that those students should be proud of.

Could all Parents/Guardians/Carers please talk with their students about any medical needs that they may have. Please note the following:

Students should always carry **Ventolin** Puffers, Epi-Pens, Diabetic Requirements with them on outings – often classes go to sporting or other activities out of the classroom or school. Sporting bags are locked in the change rooms during class time and are not always accessible. If your student has **newly diagnosed** or **changed medical conditions** it is vital that the school is notified of this information.

Any students with **Anaphalaxis** are required to have **epi-pens (current date)** as follows:

- One to be kept with the updated student's Action Plan at the School Office at all times, to be labelled with student's name. (Staff members will take this one when student is out of school on an excursion, on camp or at sport)
- Their own personal named pen to be kept with the student at all times.
- Any changes to their Action Plan must be provided to the school. If your student no longer has an allergy we require this
 information in writing from your Doctor.

Students with Asthma - Parents are asked to provide to the school an updated Asthma Action Plan and an in-date labelled Ventolin to be kept in the Sick Bay at all times. (Staff members will take this one when student is out of school on an excursion, on camp or at sport).

It is very important for students with Asthma to keep their own personal Ventolin puffer with them at all times and not just kept in their bag due to classrooms/learning areas not always being close to locker areas and in an emergency asthma situation, time is of most importance.

The school is **not** permitted to provide any of our supply of medication to students unless a student urgently requires an epipen or Ventolin and none has been provided to school. Please note the following guidelines re medication for students: If your student requires **antihistamines** for **hayfever** or **cramp medication**, **pain medication** etc. they are able to carry just **one single dose** of their medication **with them**, or if your child's medication is required on an ongoing basis, parents can complete a Medication Authority Form (name, dosage, etc) and give the medication to Office staff who will lock it securely away in Sick Bay in a named file for your son or daughter to access during the school day as needed/required. Alternatively if your child presents to the office with headaches, etc the office staff will phone parents to ask for some pain medication to be dropped off at school.

If students need to take regular daily medication during school hours, parents are asked to complete a Medication Authority Form form (which can be emailed to parents or sent home with your son or daughter upon request) and hand the completed form and medication to a Sick Bay staff member in the office, who will then lock it securely away in a named file for your son or daughter in Sick Bay.

Students then need to report to the office at the correct time as listed on the form and an office staff member will assist your son or daughter. **Students are forbidden to offer any medication to another student.**

Please check that your student's medications are in date, this is a vital requirement especially for Epi-Pens and Ventolin. If you receive a letter from the school reminding you of this need to update, please respond as soon as possible to ensure the safety of your child.

Please advise your son/daughter that **emergency supplies** of medications such as Ventolin and Epipens (in case of an asthma and anaphylaxis emergency) are available in sickbay if they see Office Staff. All Oberon staff are aware of where this medication is located in the case of an emergency.

During the warmer weather please remind your child to drink plenty of water during the day. Students are permitted to take water bottles into class.

These guidelines are in place to ensure the health and safety of all our students.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PARENTS - SICK BAY

If your son or daughter becomes unwell at school they must ask their teacher to give them a note and come straight to the Office to be signed into Sick Bay.

If the student is too unwell to remain at school a staff member in the office will then telephone a Parent/Guardian.

Please remind your son or daughter that Sick Bay is a place for sick students to rest before being picked up by a parent or to rest for 15 minutes before returning to class. It is not a place for extended stays.

It is vitally important for parents to provide

up-to-date contact numbers and emergency numbers in case of illness or emergency.

Please remember that if your child is sick the best place for them to recover is at home.



Please remind your son/daughter to come to the office if unwell and <u>not</u> to telephone or message parents themselves.
