PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Annual Report Summary

At the School Council on Wednesday 13th March we held the Oberon High School Annual General Meeting where office bearers for the 2024 school year were finalised. I am pleased to announce the following parents were elected to the following leadership positions:

As I mentioned in the previous Newsletter it was pleasing to have a number of new parents elected to School Council. Welcome and congratulations to our new and returning representatives:

At the Annual General Meeting I tabled the 2023 Annual Report which was approved for publication. Once this has been approved by the Department of Education it will be available on our school website for the school community to read. I will let you know when this occurs.

The Annual Report is completed by all schools each year to provide a summary of how each State Government School across Victoria performed against other schools taking into account their socio-economic demographics. The data set comparison is compiled by the Department of Education. This comparison is against a variety of data sets, reflecting both results from 2023 and also in some categories as an average over the previous 4 years. The comparison includes VCE results, teacher judgements of academic progress, student perceptions, staff perceptions, parent perceptions, student attendance, student pathways and student retention. Our Report indicates that we are rated in front of the State and similar schools in most categories.

In summary the school has performed very well not only in 2023 but also over the past four years in comparison to other State Government Secondary Schools and also to schools with similar socio-economic profiles as ours. As a school community we should be very proud of the education that is provided to the students that attend Oberon High. If there are school community members who wish to further discuss the Report or require further clarification, feel free to contact me at school.

NAPLAN Testing

The 2024 NAPLAN testing began on Wednesday $13^{\rm th}$ March and concluded on Monday $18^{\rm th}$ March.

As parents it is important to remember that NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children.

An individual student NAPLAN Report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern.

Interim Reports

Parents will be able to access Interim Reports on the Xuno Portal at 4 pm on Thursday 28th March. If parents are having trouble accessing the Reports, you should contact the school.

Student/Parent/Teacher Conferences

The school has scheduled Student/Parent/Teacher Conferences for week 1 of Term 2. These will be held on Thursday 18^{th} April, with the school day changed to run from 11.30 am – 7.30 pm. Parents will be able to make booking appointments via Xuno from Thursday 28^{th} March, 4 pm and students are expected to attend the appointments with their parents to discuss their academic progress.

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 Ron Thompson Scholarship I am pleased to announce that Year 10 student Akira Parker has been awarded the Ron Thompson scholarship in 2024. Asher will receive financial support for the next three years to support her with her studies. Akira joins Year 12 student Cammy Brown and Year 11 student Asher Grant as current recipients of this scholarship. Open Night The school held our Open Night on Thursday 21st March, with a great attendance from prospective students and their families. As a follow up to the night, we will be running tours for interested families every Wednesday and Friday at 9.30am beginning on Wednesday 27th March and then continuing until Wednesday 8th May. Most of the questions that I answered on the night related to the school zone and the Department of Education 'Priority Placement Policy'. Due to the expected high levels of student population growth in future years in Armstrong Creek the school has been instructed to manage enrolments. In order to do this we are following the Priority Placement Policy which has two criteria: 	 DET Priority Placement: students for whom the school is the designated neighbourhood school students with a sibling at the same permanent address who are attending the school at the same time School Uniform A reminder to Parents that all students are expected to wear the correct school uniform at all times. There are a range of options available through our uniform supplier PSW in Geelong. If you haven't already done so can you ensure that all uniform is labelled with your family name, so that this can be returned if found at school. Last day of Term A reminder to Parents and students that the last day of Term 1 is Thursday 28th March. School will finish at 2.30 pm, school buses have been notified. There are no classes for students on this day; the school day runs from 11.30 am - 7.30 pm and Students attend interviews at school with their Parents/Guardians at allotted times between these hours.	 What is it? Students from Years 7-12 can select to enter an online competition where they answer questions in test conditions. There are multiple subjects to choose from. Each test has an individual cost and allows the student to see their results against other schools and to reward and acknowledge high academic achievement. Tests will be held at school between 5th -30th August. The competition questions are set in modern, real-world scenarios where school students are tested on their ability to apply classroom learning to new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. There are 6 available competitions and subjects offered include literacy (English, Writing and Spelling Bee - Year 7 only) and STEM (Mathematics, Science and Digital Technologies- Year 7 only). ICAS recognises every participant with a certificate, and top achievers with a personalised medallion. Over the years the ICAS medal and certificates have held pride of place in the portfolios of millions of students. "ICAS prepares our students for the future because it gives them an opportunity to challenge themselves beyond what they just cover in class and to tackle questions that have a competitive level of rigour and an international standard." Oberon Diversity Cross Country

On Monday afternoon 25th March from Periods 4-6, all Oberon students will participate in the Cross-Country Colour Diversity Run. Students will walk/jog/run over 3km or 5km. Students can be out of uniform on this day and are asked to bring a gold coin donation. Parents are reminded to check Xuno and give permission for their child to participate in the colour run aspect of the day.

This is an important sporting carnival that not only looks at students competing in Cross Country events but also shines a light upon an issue of inclusiveness. On the day, there will be colour powder stations for students to run through. The colour powder symbolises the inclusiveness of all students no matter their race, gender, sexuality or disability. All measures have been taken to ensure that this event is safe for all students. The staff will do their best to throw the powder at the torso, however wind and other factors can cause the powder to



protrude on the face. You may wish for your child to bring their own eye protection such as sunglasses or goggles. If the weather allows, there will also be water sprayed at students to enhance the carnival experience.

The colour powder used in the event is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly consisting of 98% corn starch and 2% food colouring. It will likely washout of your child's clothing, however we recommend that your child wears a plain colour (in their House colour) shirt that you don't mind being coloured. Please note that a frequently asked questions document about the safety of the coloured powder that will be used at this event is attached as a PDF document with the Newsletter email. This document is also attached to the Xuno event on the Parent Portal.

All Students are still able to participate in the event and not be sprayed with colour powder. If your child does not wish to part take in the colour component of the event <u>please decline the event</u>.

Students are asked to bring a spare change of shirt and a towel if they are a bus traveller to help reduce the amount of colour powder contaminating the buses.

STUDENT ABSENCES

A reminder to all parents of the importance of phoning in absences early on the morning of your child's absence.

For your convenience you can leave a message on our absence line number 4241 8088 or enter it on Xuno.

Our SMS system will send a message out each day at 11 am to those parents whose child is absent from any class without notification.

LATE PASSES

If your child arrives late to school they must first report to the student end of the Office with a note signed by a Parent or Guardian or they can state that a parent has phoned the school or entered it in on Xuno.

EARLY LEAVE PASSES

If your child needs to leave school early for an appointment please ensure that you either:

- send a signed note with them which we ask students to give to the office when they arrive at school. Office staff will then enter on the roll that the student will be leaving early on that day.
- enter it on Xuno
- phone the office in advance.
- email the school in advance

It is of great help to the office staff if students could please remember to report to the office at the arranged time of departure.

If you have an unexpected reason for your child to leave school early please phone the school on 5241 8000 as early as possible to allow plenty of time to locate your child in their timetabled class to have them at the office ready when you arrive. A reminder that the school does not have a PA system for contacting students, so if parents phone or call in to school during Recess or lunch break to pick your child up and they don't know you are coming, it will be difficult to locate them until they are back in class.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Information for Parents

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. The applicant must be one of the following on the first day of Term 1 (Monday 29th January 2024) or Term 2 (Monday 15th April 2024):

- A parent or carer who is the beneficiary of a financially means-tested card
- A temporary foster carer
- A student who is 16 years or older and holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card)

A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$150 for primary school students

\$250 for secondary school students

How to Apply

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
