PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Staffing Changes

There has been a number of changes to our staffing due to extended leave absences and also a staff member resigning their position.

- Mr Justin Kristiansen has resigned from the Department of Education and Oberon High School. We have employed Mr Luke McNabb to replace Justin teaching Humanities.
- Ms Gabby Branell joins us, teaching German Languages. Gabby is replacing Ms Mia James who has begun family leave.
- Mr Mark Orton remains on leave and we are seeking a replacement to teach his Indonesian classes.
- Felix Walsh and Macey Feldman working in our Disability Inclusion workforce
- I have advertised a Substantive Assistant Principal position to begin from the start of Term 3. We are currently working through this process and hope to be able to announce this appointment prior to the end of Term.

Year 7 Enrolments 2025

We have received our Year 7 enrolments from our feeder Primary Schools for the 2025 school year. Whilst the final number of students in Year 7 in 2025 won't be finalised until later in the year, the trend that we are seeing is that the number of families choosing Oberon as their first choice remains very strong.

RECONCILIATION WEEK



The National Reconciliation Week theme for 2024, **Now More Than Ever**, is a reminder to all of us that no matter what, the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will —and must —continue.

Over the past week at Oberon High School, we have celebrated the contributions and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in conjunction with the need for truth telling in our society.

In Year 7, English students have revisited **Cathy Freeman's** historic win at the Sydney 2000 Olympics looking at the significance of her carrying both the Aboriginal and Australian flags on her victory lap. In Year 8, English students have examined the importance of **Archie Roach's** *Took the Children Away* song with a focus on truth telling. In Year 9, English students have read **Adam Goodes'** words on the importance of Leadership, particularly when circumstances are difficult. In Year 10, English students have used the interactive documentary **K'gari** to understand the importance of Language and Truth telling in moving towards Reconciliation.

The **Moberon** Student Group have started the process of ensuring that every classroom at Oberon High School has an Acknowledgment of Country statement placed in a prominent place to recognise our presence on **Wadawurung Country**.

In the coming weeks **Moberon** students at Oberon High School will be attending the Immersive [Exhibition- Journey on Wadawurung Country presented by the Wadawurung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation](#). This is a free exhibition from the 28th May to 16th June, and I encourage members of our community to attend.

Now more than ever, the work continues. In treaty making, in truth-telling, in understanding our history, in education, and in tackling racism. We need connection. We need respect. We need action. And we need change. Now more than ever, we need reconciliation.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PARENTS - SICK BAY



An important reminder to Parents/Guardians that the Sick Bay at Oberon is for students to attend when they become unwell or are injured whilst at school. Sick Bay staff at Oberon are finding that they are often being asked by students to provide medical care for illnesses or injuries that have occurred at home or on the weekend. Our Sick Bay staff are first aid trained (not nurses) and are able to assist students who present to Sick Bay with an illness or injury that has occurred at school only. If your student has an illness or has received an injury at home that may require medical attention we ask Parents/Guardians to keep your student at home until they feel better or seek medical advice from your Doctor.

Sick Bay is a place for sick or injured students to rest and receive first aid care for illnesses or injuries **that occur at school**, before being picked up by a parent or to rest for 15 minutes before returning to class. It is not a place for extended stays. If your student is in Sick Bay with a medical issue that may worsen or require further investigation or observation, eg possible concussion or breathing difficulties it is especially important for parents to pick up your student as soon as possible as our Sick Bay staff are unable to provide the ongoing medical care and observation that may be required. It is not advisable for students with conditions that may worsen to return to class.

If your child is sick the best place for them to recover is at home.



Please remind your son/daughter to come to the office if unwell and not telephone or message parents themselves. It is a requirement of the Department of Education and also it is a safety measure that all students, if unwell or injured, to firstly be seen by a first aid attendant.

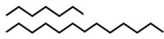

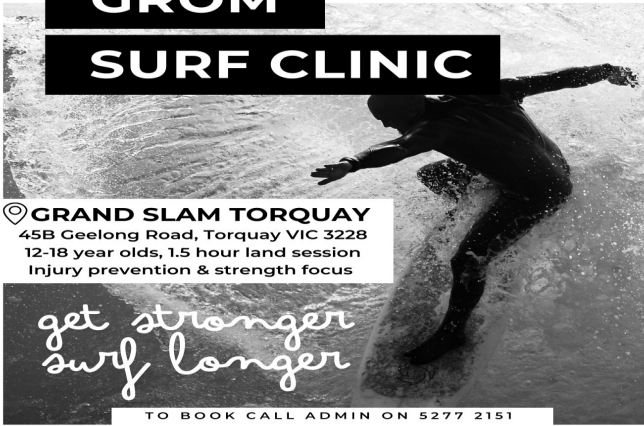

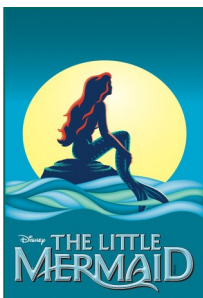

- Long-sleeved t-shirts under Uniform
- External branded jackets

If you are out of uniform you must bring a note and get a uniform pass

Passes are available at the office at the beginning of the day for incorrect trousers, shoes or sports uniform only.
